Dates in Windows 10


Some indexers using Windows 10 have reported the publication date changes of its own volition to the current date. All those we have investigated so far have had the date setting incorrect in Windows. This note provides details on how to correct the date setting.

The objective is to get the date at the bottom right side if the screen to look like this:




That is to say the date must be in the format dd/mm/yyyy.

Click on the Windows icon at bottom left of the screen and select 'Settings' (just above 'Power'). Select 'Time & Language' which will give something like this:



Set the Country to 'Australia'.

Then Select 'Date & Time' to show this:



The 'Short date' will probably be wrong. Select "change date and time format which should look like this:


Click on 'Short date'




Scroll down and if the desired date format is there select it. Then on exiting it should be OK.


The chances are that the desired format will not be there, as above. In that case under 'Related Settings' select 'Additional date, time & regional settings':




Under 'Region' select 'Change date, time or number formats'.



Check the Short Date options, if it is there select it. If not select 'Additional settings':



Choose the 'Date' tab:



Type in the 'Short date' in the required format as above and select 'OK'.

Then back out selecting 'OK' where necessary.
